Accountability Committee

The Accountability Committee shall schedule and coordinate the Superintendent's performance evaluations. This shall include coordinating quarterly performance discussions with the Superintendent.

Audit Committee

The Audit Committee holds the Office of Internal Compliance functionally responsible for the planning, performance, and reporting of audits and has full access to all records, properties and personnel of Atlanta Public Schools. The Commission is composed of three Board members and three non-voting advisory members who are residents of the City of Atlanta.

Board Professional Development Committee

The Board Professional Development Committee shall plan all Board professional development activities.

Budget Committee

Pursuant to the Charter governing the Atlanta Independent School System, the budget commission shall perform the following duties:

- Prepare the anticipated revenues for the school system
- Allocate a sum sufficient to provide for debt service, including a sinking fund and interest on bond indebtedness, and any other appropriations required by law
- Adjust the anticipated revenues in the event the income of the school system is increased or decreased
- Hold public hearings
